

# Why We Give

My wife Cynthia and I give to the Westminster Foundation (Princeton Presbyterians) in part because of our own experience in college in the late 1960s. The campus ministry and related religious activities at our small Presbyterian college shaped both of us in wonderful ways that remain with us more than fifty years later. We covet for today's students an experience similar to our own. Of course, contemporary ministry cannot uncritically replicate what was done in the past. It must shape itself for a new generation in a new setting.

This is precisely what campus ministers Len and Andrew Scales are doing. In today's culture where Christianity is often wrongly perceived (and, sadly, sometimes wrongly presented) as narrowly dogmatic and moralistic, where faith is reduced to a matter of deciding who is in and who is out of God's beloved community, the ministry of Princeton Presbyterians celebrates the Christ whose unconditional love invites everyone. In the midst of a high pressure Ivy League academic environment, students find a place where they are valued for who they are, not for what they have achieved—a place where they can wrestle with issues of faith and discern where God may be leading them.



## **UKirk Ewing**

We are excited to share that the Westminster Foundation has planted a new campus ministry at The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) called UKirk Ewing! This pilot program has grown out of years of conversations with the Westminster Foundation Board and the UKirk Collegiate Ministries Association, the PC(USA)'s campus ministry network. The stability you help provide for the Westminster Foundation makes it possible for us to dream about how to continue to expand our care for young people in New Jersey.

Our Ministry Fellow Rosa Ross has gathered a half-dozen students for a queer-led weekly Bible Study and formed an undergraduate leadership team. UKirk Ewing recently partnered with university administrators and neighboring Presbyterian congregations to host TCNJ's first Trans Day of Remembrance worship service.

We can't wait to see how this inclusive, thoughtful, and loving fellowship thrives in the spring semester and beyond! Funding for this pilot year has come from grants given by Ewing Covenant Presbyterian Church and the Synod of the Northeast.
